For maximum flexibility, many travelers combine cards. For example, they may use a Chase Freedom card for everyday purchases and transfer those points to a Sapphire card to unlock travel redemption options.

How Much Are Chase Ultimate Rewards Points Worth?

The value of Chase points depends on how you redeem them.

When using the Chase travel portal, the value depends on your specific card.

Typical redemption values:

Card	Value Per Point Through Chase Travel
Chase Sapphire Preferred	1.25 cents per point
Chase Sapphire Reserve	1.5 cents per point
Other Chase cards	Usually 1 cent per point

This means:

Example:

If you have 50,000 Chase points:

With Sapphire Preferred:

50,000 points × \$0.0125 = approximately \$625 in travel value

With Sapphire Reserve:

50,000 points × \$0.015 = approximately \$750 in travel value

However, the value can sometimes be higher when transferring points to airline or hotel partners.

How To Access The Chase Travel Portal

Example: Booking an International Flight With Chase Points

Imagine you want to book a flight from New York to Paris.

The cash price:

\$900

You have a Chase Sapphire Preferred card.

Your redemption value:

1 point = 1.25 cents

Required points:

$\$900 \div \$0.0125 = \text{approximately } 72,000 \text{ points}$

Instead of paying \$900 cash, you can redeem your Chase points.

However, before booking, you should compare this option with transferring points to an airline partner because you may sometimes get better value.

Should You Use Chase Travel Portal or Transfer Points?

Transferring points can make sense when:

Example:

A business class flight that costs \$4,000 may require fewer points through an airline program.

2. Booking Luxury Hotels

Hyatt often provides strong value compared with normal hotel bookings.

3. During Airline Award Promotions

Some programs occasionally offer better redemption opportunities.

Getting the most value requires strategy.

Compare Cash Prices First

Before redeeming points, calculate the value.

A flight costing \$150 may not be the best use of points.

- **Luxury hotels**
 - **Peak travel periods**
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Avoid Random Redemptions

Many travelers waste points by using them for:

- **Low-cost flights**
- **Small discounts**
- **Poor-value hotels**

Always calculate:

Cash price ÷ points required = value per point

Booking Hotels Through Chase Travel Portal

Hotels work similarly to flights.

You can search:

- **Number of guests**

You can compare:

- **Hotel ratings**
- **Reviews**
- **Amenities**
- **Prices**

However, hotel bookings require extra attention.
